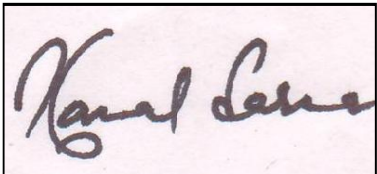

- To complete the indoor stadium and gymnasium.

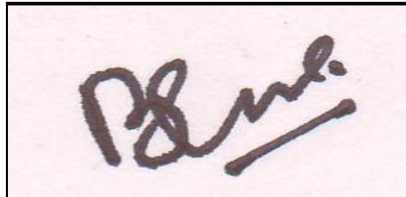
