1.00 The College:

1.01: Pub Kamrup College, located at Baihata Chariali, Kamrup- Assam is an institution of general higher education with a limited number of professional and add-on courses. This College was established in 1972 as a result of decade-long popular craving and unrelenting effort for such an institute. The College fraternity as well as the locality at large is grateful to the concerned doyens for their able guidance and leadership in the act of initiation of the College. Started with Arts stream, there are a total of 50 permanent teaching positions (5 lying vacant); additionally a good number of Guest faculty members are engaged in all the three faculties- Arts, Science and Vocational Courses, and in a few professional courses in the College at present.

Baihata Chariali, though semi-urban in nature, is a busy centre of trade, academic activities, and of communication. It is the junction point of two National Highways- 15 and 27. The Madan Kamdev Devalaya (remnant of the 10th- 12th century shrine, now a govt. recognized tourist spot) is at a distance of 2 kms from the College.

5.00 Course structure in four year under graduate programme (FYUGP) under NEP

The Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) of Gauhati University is as per UGC's Curricular Framework, published in November 2022. The course structure of FYUGP is built on the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS). Under the NEP's FYUGP, it is a 4-year degree programme with the provision of multiple exits and entries, leading to the award of certificate, diploma or a degree. In FYUGP, we get a Bachelor's Degree with Major after 3 years and a degree with Major & Honours after 4 year.

The FYUGP at GU is designed to offer two types of Bachelor's Degrees to the students at the end of the successful completion of the programme — (i) Bachelor's Degree in a Stream and (ii) Bachelor's Degree in a Discipline. The FYUGP is divided into two parts — (i) Core Courses and (ii) Common Courses. The minimum credit allocation for a 3-year programme is 84 credits in Core Courses and 36 credits in Common Courses, which comes to a total of minimum 120 credits for a 3-year programme. With the fourth year, the minimum credit requirements becomes 160. A student can however earn up to a maximum of 132 credits in a 3-year programme and 176 by the fourth year.

5.01 Core courses

The Core Courses determine the ultimate degree, diploma, or certificate a student will earn at the end of third (or fourth) year, second year, or first year, respectively. The performance in the Core Courses will also determine the grade of the student in the final examinations. Total minimum credit requirement is 84 for the Core Courses, which translates to 21 courses (i.e. papers) with a credit allocation of 4 per course (paper). A student will need to study at least three Core subjects. The Core Courses have to be chosen among a plethora of subjects offered in our college (see the section 2.02 for subject studied in our college) for both the types of degrees, respectively. In case of a Bachelor's Degree in a Stream, the components of the Core Courses are Major and / or Minors, while in case of a Bachelor's Degree in a Discipline, there are no Majors and Minors.

5.01 (a) Major and Minors

In case of a Bachelor's Degree in a Stream, a student either chooses a Major and Minors or just Minors from among the subjects. In any case, a student needs to complete 21 courses or 84 credits by the third year. Please see the examples that we have given in this booklet. A Major course MUST carry a minimum credit of 60 and a Minor course should carry a minimum credit of 12. Usually, for majority of the students, the Core Course will consist of one Major and two Minors. But if a student desires, using the free credits (as described earlier), s/he can easily complete a third Minor as well

5.01 (b) Common courses

The common courses are to be studied by all students alike and all-together they carry a total credits of 36 over a 3-year period. These courses are further divided into five (5) subcategories, as described below.

A. Multi-disciplinary Courses

These are 3-credit courses spanning over two different groups of subjects in our college- (i) Natural and Physical Science (MUST for Arts stream), (ii) Humanities and Social Sciences (MUST for Science stream). The level of these courses is of Class XII. Each student need to take at any three papers, each with 3-credits from these sub-groups during Semesters 1-3.

B. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)

This is an 8-credit course covering Modern Indian Languages (MIL) and English Usage (Communication). Each student needs to complete two papers of 4-credits each – one from English Usage and other from the group of MIL, especially designed for this purpose. These courses have to be taken during Semesters 1-2 and 5-6.

C. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)

These are various skill courses with total credit allocation of 9 needs to be studied during Semesters 1-3, each having 3 credits.

D. Value Added Courses (VAC)

The VAC courses in the College will have two sub groups — (i) Understanding India, and (ii) Environmental Education. All together they will have a credit allocation of 6 to be completed during semester 1, 2 and 4.

E. Internship

All students are to carry out an Internship with a credit allocation of 4. The internship can be carried out in Semester 3.

The fourth year

In the FYUGP, the fourth year is at par with the first year of a Master's programme, as a student can directly take admission into the second year of a Master's programme after the successful completion of the FYUGP. In the fourth year, a student has to complete one compulsory paper on Research Methodology (REM) in the Semester VII, which is a 4-credit theory paper. The rest of courses will consist of Advanced Core Courses and a Dissertation. The detailed structure for the fourth year will be published soon.

In this case, a student takes a three Minor subjects each with a minimum 6 courses over a period of three years. Apart from these, the student also needs to take 6 Core courses during Semesters 4-6 where s/he can pick any of the three core subjects s/he has already studied.

7.00 List of prerequisites & requirements for core course and common course options

The prerequisites are subjects that a student must have studied (and passed) in an earlier level of education (usually Class XI & XII) in order to be able to choose a subject. In contrast to the prerequisites, requirements are certain conditions attached to some core subjects. For example, if a student wants to study Botany as a core subject, Chemistry as another core subjects has to be chosen. This is a 'requirement'. However, if one chooses Chemistry, there are no requirements. In following table, the prerequisites and requirements for various courses are given.

8.00 Degree in a Discipline

Pub Kamrup College offers following degrees in discipline under GU-FYUGP. These are mentioned below:

1. BVoc in Food Processing and Quality Management
2. BVoc in IT (Software Development and System Administration)
3. Bachelor Degree in Computer Application

4. Bachelor Degree in Business Administration

The salient features of degree in a discipline are as follows

- Has the same FYUGP structure – i.e. Core Courses with a minimum of 84 credits and Common Courses credits of 36 (in a 3-year programme).
- No Majors or Minors.
- Students study certain pre-defined courses designed for the respective discipline

Unlike the FYUGP in a stream i.e. B.Sc or BA, students admitted into a degree in a discipline need not require to study three different subjects in a semester. Instead they have to study three different courses from the same subject as the Core course. The course structure for the common courses remains the same like in B.Sc or BA degree.

9.00 Teaching, Research, Organisation

9.01 Teaching: The entire College fraternity is single-mindedly devoted to the task of nurturing the career and character building efforts of students coming from diverse economic background, social milieu and academic environment. At present the number of regular students in the college is **3246**.

Well-planned teaching, path-finding counseling, frequent use of ICT tools, upgraded classroom and readily available handouts are the basic methods and amenities that the fundamental teaching- learning process is enriched with.

The teachers of the college do realize their key role to play in the knowledge landscape in the present scenario while shaping our next generation of citizens. They always try to contribute with high quality teaching and single minded devotion in other duties to deliver their public service as teachers. They atone and enrich their subject knowledge through regular research publications in reputed journals, and in book forms. Extensive use of technology like smart class, use of ICT and other technological advances is one of the top priorities among the teachers. The number of full time teacher in the college at present is 61.

9.02 Research: Research is considered a corequisite for high-quality higher education. With proper focus on this area, the laboratories in various departments have been upgraded to meet up the demand of the new curricular needs. The DBT funded Advanced level Biotech Hub in the college, established in 2011 is an added vista in the research landscape of the college. The laboratories of the Computer Science Department and Biophysics of the college has been recognized as a Ph.D. research laboratory by Gauhati University. The vocational courses in the college are courses contributing to the research and innovation, especially in the fields of food science and computer software. Addition of B.Voc and M.Voc in Food Processing and Quality Management, and B.Voc. in Software Development and System Administration have proved to be innovative chapters in a the entire district, namely Kamrup. This department has developed specific innovative culture among student communities. Even the election to the students' body of the college is conducted through a Computerized Voting System with unique software developed by student of the vocational course in Software Development and System Administration.

The Teaching Fraternity of Pub Kamrup College is earnestly engaged in various forms of research works in different fields and areas. A good number of teachers of the College are pursuing Ph.D. works; some others have already attained Ph.D. and M.Phil. Degrees. The teachers endeavour to promote academic excellence in the College by holding departmental seminars, symposia and workshops of State and National status. Teachers of the College are frequently engaged in subject related Research Projects. Students are provided the opportunity of availing exposure to reputed institutions, sites of cultural,

environmental, historical and archaeological importance in order to acquaint them with the potential areas of specialized higher studies and research.

Seminars and popular talks are regularly organized to introduce the students with the latest environment concerns such as Decarbonization, Green Energy, Plastic Free Environment, Sustainable Development Plans, Global Warming etc.

The solar energy plant of the college is an example of our serious concern about a green earth.

Green Diary: All the students of this college are required to mandatorily maintain a 'Green Diary' during their stay in the college.

Environmental Sciences Studies is offered in the college as an integral subject of the university curriculum. What the College innovatively adds is compulsory maintenance of a 'Green Diary' since 2012-13 by every student under which each student has to plant at least three saplings in his/ her homestead and has to maintain the record of nurturing the same, and other environmental activities done by him/ her during the course hours. The 'Green Diary' is evaluated annually and in BA/ BSc 4th semester, this diary becomes a partial fulfillment of their project work in environmental studies evaluated for 10 marks assigned in the syllabus. Moreover, the college rewards the best student at the end of the academic session for excellence shown in maintaining Green Diary as well as the saplings planted. This is a humble effort for promotion of environmental awareness among the students.

12.01 College Magazine: পূব কামৰূপ মহাবিদ্যালয় আলোচনী (Pub Kamrup College Magazine), published annually is considered as the mouthpiece of the College Students' Union. It is the rearer of young talents in the fields of art and literature.

services. The total area of the Library is approx 552 sq mtr with extended reading room facility.

Collection : Pub Kamrup College Library tries to provide the users with the best sort of qualitative and quantitative documents that can be done with the available financial sources and supports. The Library holds approx 32000 numbers of books accessioned in the register.

Besides its normal book collection the Library holds a number of e-resources. The Library subscribes 12 numbers of regional News papers (Daily/ Weekly), and 9 Magazines on regular basis. Moreover a number of rare manuscripts and other archival items are also collected and preserved in its museum.

Journal Section: The Library has a subscription to 15 print journals of international and national repute, which are displayed in the Journal Section with a separate reading arrangement.

Institutional Membership: Pub Kamrup College Library is an Institutional Life Member of National Book Trust's organisation i.e. NBT Book Club.

Awards : The Library provides two awards to its student-users annually:

i) Best Reading Room User Award : As an attempt to encourage the student readers, Pub Kamrup College Library confers this award on the student who utilizes the Reading Room for the longest period in the academic session.

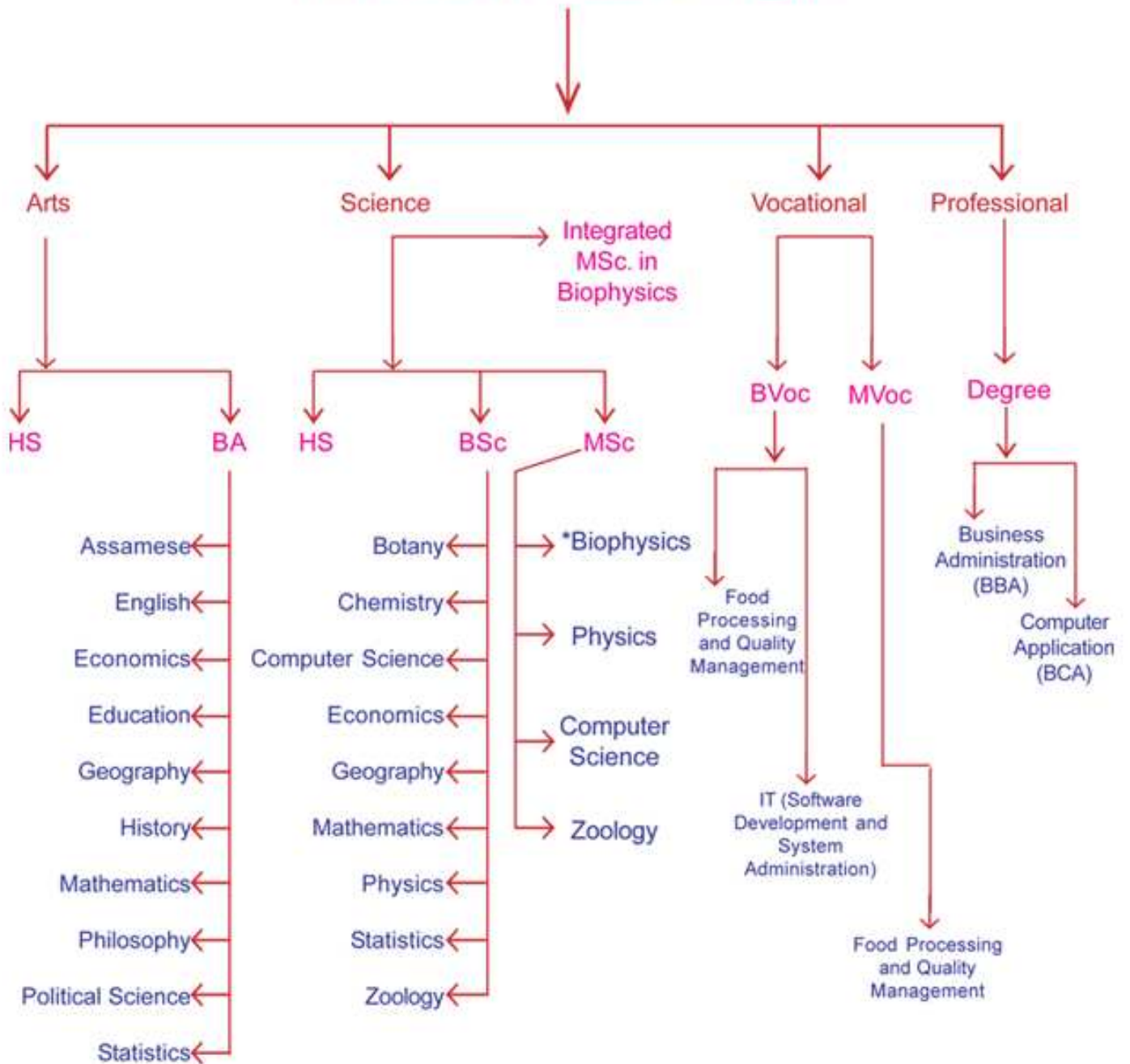

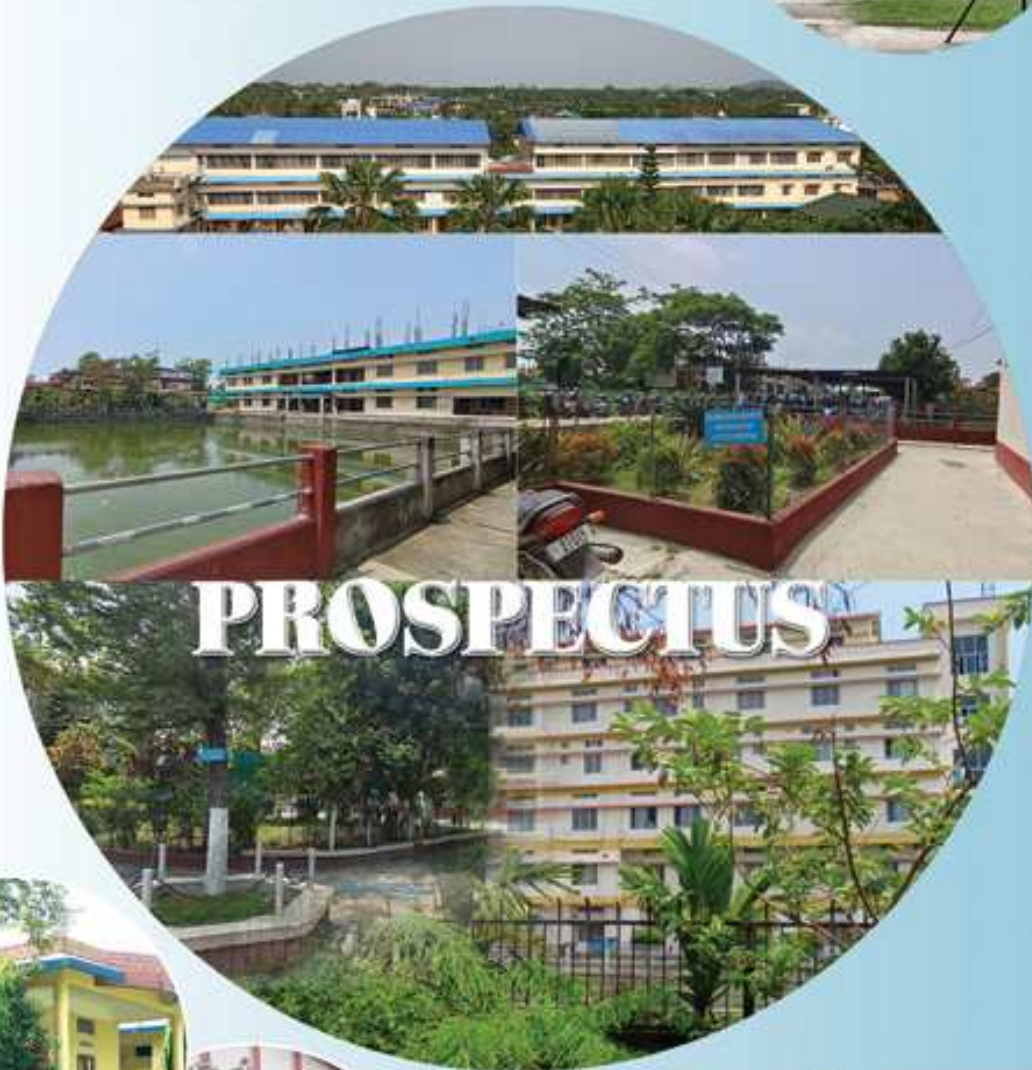
