About the College

Pub Kamrup College is a premier higher education institution in the northern bank of the River Brahmaputra in Assam, India. The College was established in 1972 as a long-standing vision conceived by some of the eminent scholars and well-wishers of the locality of Baihata Chariali, Kamrup, Assam. The College is located in the Baihata Chariali, the junction point of two National Highways- 15 and 31, serving as the northern entry point to the Guwahati and upper Assam. The historic *Madan Kamdev Devalaya* (remnant of the 10th- 12th century shrine, now a Govt. recognized Archeological site as well as tourist spot) is at a distance of 3 km from the College. With the motto of *तमसो मा ज्योतिर्गमय, (Tamaso Ma Jyotirgamaya)* meaning illumination with the light of knowledge, the Pub Kamrup College is a significant centre of higher education and research in Assam. The College is registered under Section 2(f) and 12 (B) of the UGC Act 1956 in August 2002. The college fraternity is committed to quality enhancement, continuous institutional improvement and has made persistent effort to uphold excellence in teaching, learning and governance. In the process the college has successfully completed the third cycle of NAAC accreditation in 2023 and has been awarded 'B++' Grade with CGPA 2.8.

In its foundational years, Pub Kamrup College offered courses related to the Arts stream only but over the years it has grown and attained high academic standards, offers both graduate and post-graduate courses in the Arts, Science and Vocational studies. Today, the college has 18 departments offering H.S., Undergraduate, Post Graduate (P.G.), and Vocational programmes under the affiliation of Gauhati University as well as Assam Science and Technology University (ASTU). Apart from that the college offers

certain self-sustained skill based certificate courses aligned with rapidly evolving, technology-driven job market. More recently, the College has also introduced the Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) with the recognition from the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE).

The college has 50 permanent, more than 26 guest and part time dedicated teaching faculties and 26 non-teaching staff. The college library is equipped with latest editions of textbooks, reference materials, journals and digital resources that cater to the evolving curriculum and diverse interests of students and faculty. The up-to-date Central Library of the college often integrates modern technology, including computer terminals, high speed internet, and access to online databases and e-books enabling users to explore global knowledge beyond physical collections of books, journals, news papers, etc.

Aligning itself to the policies implemented by the NEP 2020, Pub Kamrup College strongly promotes a research culture within its campus. The faculty members have been rigorously publishing books, research papers with various reputed publishing houses and journals respectively. Additionally, some of our faculty members have been engaged with Minor and Major research projects in the past which were sponsored by different government agencies. The college publishes two multi-disciplinary, peer-reviewed e-journals “Quill: the mighty pen” and “ESHANA: Through Women’s Lens” that reflect its commitment to academic excellence and research.

In the present digital era an ICT-enabled classroom with robust digital infrastructure is essential in a college to enhance interactive learning, provide access to global knowledge resources, support innovative teaching methods and equip students with the digital skills required in the modern world. Course structure in four year under graduate programme (FYUGP) under NEP

The Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) of Gauhati University is as per UGC’s Curricular Framework, published in November 2022. The course structure of FYUGP is built on the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS). Under the NEP’s FYUGP, it is a 4-year degree programme with the provision of multiple exits and entries, leading to the award of certificate, diploma or a degree. In FYUGP, we get a Bachelor’s Degree with Major after 3 years and a degree with Major & Honours after 4 year.

The FYUGP at GU is designed to offer two types of Bachelor’s Degrees to the students at the end of the successful completion of the programme —

- Bachelor’s Degree in a Stream and
- Bachelor’s Degree in a Discipline.

The FYUGP is divided into two parts — (i) Core Courses and (ii) Common Courses.

The minimum credit allocation for a 3-year programme is 84 credits in Core Courses and 36 credits in Common Courses, which comes to a total of minimum 120 credits for a 3-year programme. With the fourth year, the minimum credit requirements become 160. A student can however earn up to a maximum of 132 credits in a 3-year programme and 176 by the fourth year.

Core courses:

The core courses determine the ultimate degree, diploma, or certificate a student will earn at the end of third (or fourth) year, second year, or first year, respectively. Total minimum credit requirement is 84 for the core courses, which translates to 21 courses (i.e. papers) with a credit allocation of 4 per course (paper). A student will need to study at least two core subjects. The core courses have to be chosen among a plethora of subjects offered in our college (see the section 2.02 for subject studied in our college) for both the types of degrees, respectively. In case of a Bachelor’s Degree in a Stream, the components of the core courses are major and minors, while in case of a Bachelor’s Degree in a Discipline, there are no majors and minors.

• Major and Minors

In case of a Bachelor’s Degree in a Stream, a student either chooses a Major and Minors or just Minors from among the subjects. In any case, a student needs to complete 21 courses or 84 credits by the third year. A Major course MUST carry a minimum credit of 60 and a Minor course should carry a minimum credit of 12.

Common courses:

The common courses are to be studied by all students alike and all-together they carry total credits of 36 over a 3-year period. These courses are further divided into five (5) subcategories, as described below.

- **Multi-disciplinary Courses**

These are 3-credit courses spanning over two different groups of subjects in our college- (i) Library and Information Science (ii) Humanities and Social Sciences. The level of these courses is of Class XII. Each student need to take at any three papers, each with 3-credits from these sub-groups during Semesters 1-3.

- **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)**

This is an 8-credit course covering Modern Indian Languages (MIL) and English Usage (Communication). Each student needs to complete two papers of 4-credits each – one from English Usage and other from the group of MIL, especially designed for this purpose. These courses have to be taken during Semesters 1-2.

- **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)**

These are various skill courses with total credit allocation of 9 needs to be studied during Semesters 1-3, each having 3 credits.

- **Value Added Courses (VAC)**

The VAC courses in the College will have two sub groups — (i) Understanding India, and (ii) Environmental Education. All together they will have a credit allocation of 6 to be completed during semester 1, 2 and 3.

- **Internship**

All students are to carry out an Internship with a credit allocation of 4 (Credit added to 5th Semester). Those who miss the Internship in 4th-5th Summer Break shall do the Internship after the 6th Semester (during 6th Semester Summer Break). In such cases, the 5th Semester result shall not be COMPLETE.

The fourth year

In the FYUGP, the fourth year is at par with the first year of a Master's programme, as a student can directly take admission into the second year of a Master's programme after the successful completion of the FYUGP. In the fourth year, a student has to complete one compulsory paper on Research Methodology (REM) in the Semester VII, which is a 4-credit theory paper. The rest of courses will consist of Advanced Core Courses and a Dissertation. The detailed structure for the fourth year will be published soon

List of prerequisites & requirements for core course and common course options

The prerequisites are subjects that a student must have studied (and passed) in an earlier level of education (usually Class XI & XII) in order to be able to choose a subject. In contrast to the prerequisites, requirements are certain conditions attached to some core subjects. For example, if a student wants to study Botany as a core subject, Chemistry as another core subjects has to be chosen. This is a 'requirement'. However, if one chooses Chemistry, there are no requirements.

Degree in a Discipline

Pub Kamrup College offers following degrees in discipline under GU-FYUGP.

1. B.Voc in Food Processing and Quality Management
2. B.Voc in IT (Software Development and System Administration)
3. Bachelor Degree in Computer Application (BCA)
4. Bachelor Degree in Business Administration(BBA)

The salient features of degree in a discipline are as follows

- Has the same FYUGP structure – i.e. Core Courses with a minimum of 84 credits and Common Courses credits of 36 (in a 3-year programme).
- No Majors or Minors.
- Students study certain pre-defined courses designed for the respective discipline

Unlike the FYUGP in a stream i.e. B.Sc or BA, students admitted into a degree in a discipline need not require to study different subjects in a semester. 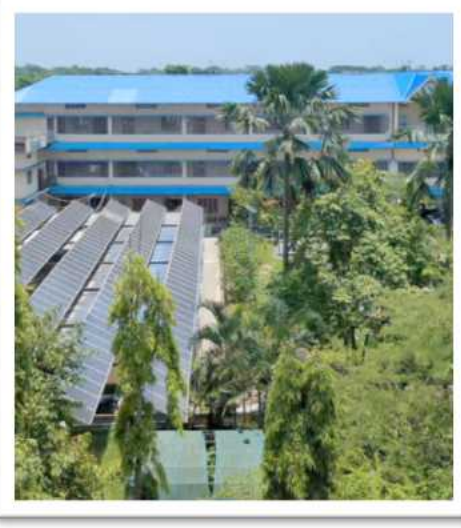

All the students of this college are required to mandatorily maintain a 'Green Diary' during their stay in the college. The Green Diary initiatives have been carried on since 2012-13.

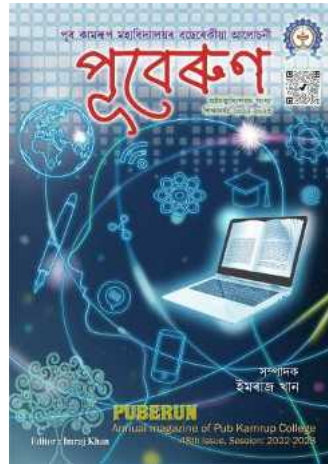

Souvenir: The College takes the initiative to publish Souvenir on some special occasions. In addition, different books are being published authored by different faculty members of the College from their end.

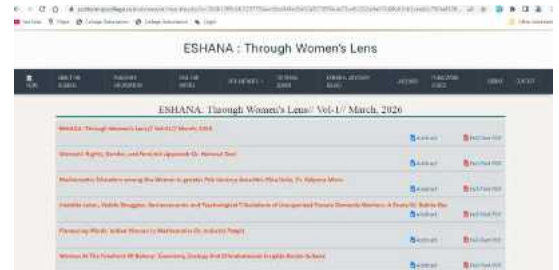

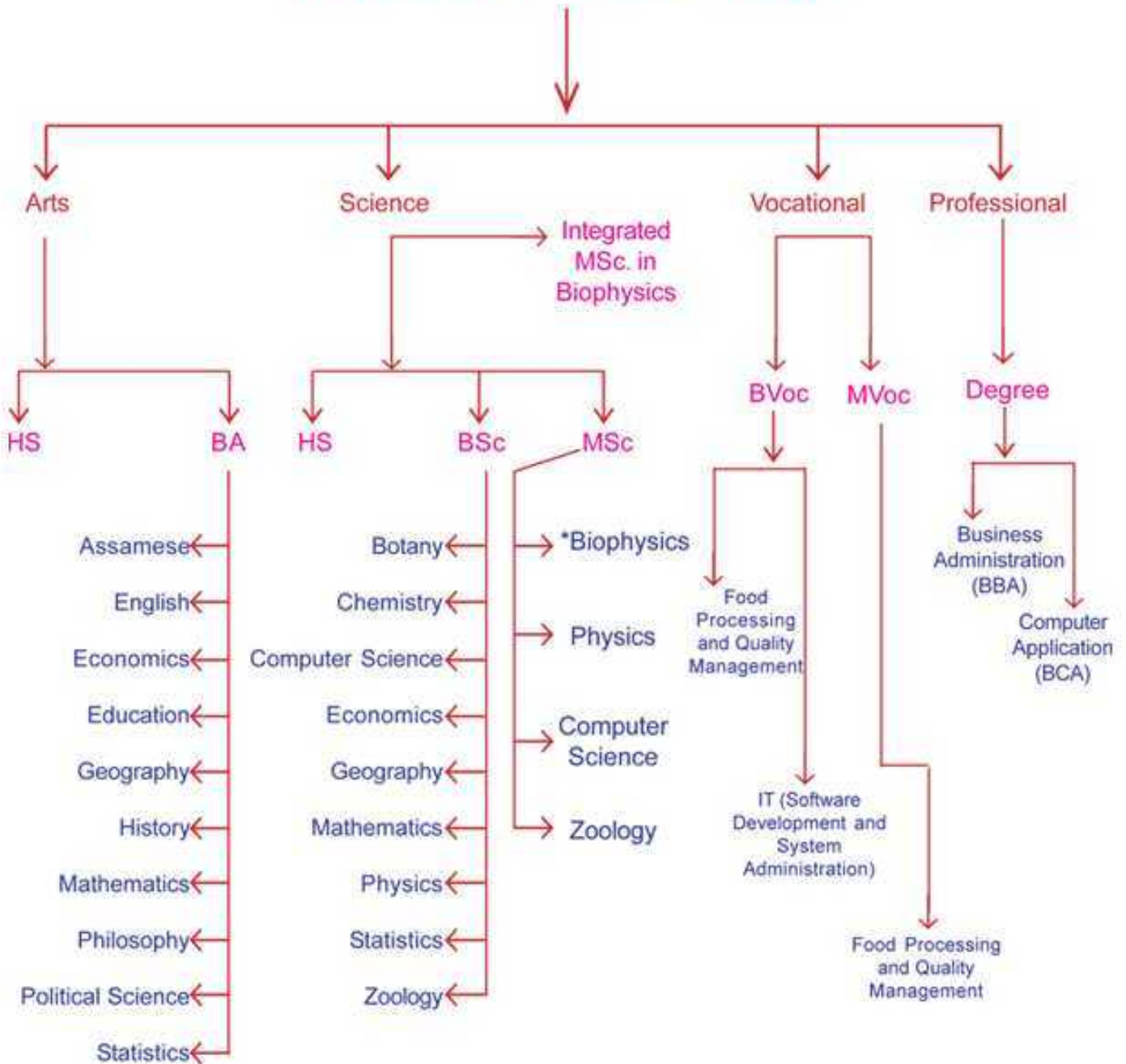
